Scholarship Terms and Conditions

Award Details

The Gramlich Scholarship is valued at \$6,000 per academic year, is valid fall and spring semesters and will be continued, if all renewal conditions are met, for eight semesters across four academic years. The award will be credited to the student's university account each semester. By accepting this scholarship as part of your financial aid award you agree to the terms and conditions of the scholarship detailed herein. Financial aid awards can be accessed through your CougarNet account (siue.edu/cougarnet). **Academic transcripts must be provided to the donor at the end of each semester.**

Gramlich Scholarship in combination with other awards and financial aid

The Gramlich Scholarship will be applied to university charges on the student's account such as tuition, fees, housing and meal plan. The Gramlich Scholarship will be considered awards to meet financial need in the packaging of financial aid. Should the crediting of the scholarship in combination with other financial aid result in excess funds on the student's account, the excess may be refunded to the student for personal expenses and books.

Renewal Conditions. (All conditions listed below must be met.)

1) Academic performance

- Completion of full-time enrollment each semester (minimum 12 hours)
- Maintain a semester and cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0.
- Continue as a declared music major pursuing any music degree
- Make satisfactory progress towards the chosen music degree, as determined by the music department faculty.
- Participate in major ensembles, as assigned by the music department faculty.
- Provide an academic transcript copy to the award donors each semester. The student must sign a FERPA waiver, allowing a third party to view their academic record.

2) Demonstration of Financial Need

The Gramlich scholarship is both a merit and need-based award. Each year, the recipient must demonstrate continuing financial need in order to re-qualify. This is achieved by filing the FAFSA no later than 1 February of the previous academic year.

3. Good Conduct
