Start of Workshop Questions to Ponder:

How so?

- 1. How many attendees currently allow students to use GenAl in some form or fashion as part of a course they teach?
- 2. How knowledgeable do you think most faculty are about GenAl uses/applications? How about students?
- 3. What do you think the biggest disconnect is between instructors and students in the age of GenAl?

6.	How have/will you handle questions of academic integrity for this learning experience?
7.	How will you assess student learning as part of your learning experience?
8.	What supports do you need to supply to students to help them learn/succeed (with or without GenAl use)?
