INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Bus Service:

Provider shall procure and maintain during the term of this Contract insurance coverage as listed below. The insurance companies providing coverage must have a B+:VI or better rating in the current edition of Best's Key Rating Guide. Provider must agree to maintain such insurance for the duration of the contract. If a policy required under this section is written on a claims-made basis and that policy is replaced or renewed, any retroactive date must coincide with, or precede commencement of services by Provider or sub-contractor under this Contract. A claims-made policy that is replaced or not renewed must have an extended reporting period of not less than two (2) years.

A. Worker's Compensation and Occupational Diseases Illinois Statutory Limits Employer's Liability \$500,000 per occurrence

B. Commercial General Liability \$2,000,000 per occurrence General Aggregate \$4,000,000

C. Comprehensive Auto Liability (including owned, hired and non-owned endorsement and shall not exclude passengers)

Combined Single Limit \$10,000,000 per occurrence

or

Bodily Injury \$10,000,000 per occurrence Property Damage \$5,000,000 per occurrence

D. All Risk Physical Damage on Buses

Umbrella liability insurance may be used to meet the general and auto liability coverage limit requirements.

Subcontractors must comply with the same insurance coverage requirements as Provider. Subcontractors shall submit the required Certificate of Insurance through the primary provider.

The Board of Trustees of Southern Illinois University shall be named as additional insured for general liability, auto liability, and physical damage coverage with a waiver of subrogation. The following wording shall appear on any Certificate of Insurance provided: "The Board of Trustees of Southern Illinois University is an additional insured for any liability arising from the activities of the Provider and/or subcontractors performing work on behalf of the Provider."

Provider shall furnish all original Certificate(s) of Insurance evidencing the required coverage to be in force on the date of this contract no less than three business days prior to the event. The receipt of any certificate does not constitute an agreement by the University that insurance requirements have been met. Failure of the University to obtain certificates or other insurance evidence from the vendor shall not be deemed a waiver by the University.
