Completion of an Associate in Arts or Science degree at Rend Lake College fulfills SIUE’s general education requirements, with the exception of an Interdisciplinary Studies course that all students must take during their junior and senior year at SIUE.

This “Transfer Program Guide” is an **example** of proposed curriculum for students to use while completing the Associate’s degree. Reading, writing and math placement could alter the course sequencing and transfer date. Therefore students should begin sequencing their reading/writing (if applicable) and math & science courses during the first semester, paying close attention to prerequisites. Students have the option of taking summer classes to lessen fall and spring course loads.

PRE-DECLARATION REQUIREMENTS FOR THE BACHELOR OF SCIENCE - BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

- A cumulative GPA of 2.25 (on a 4.0 scale) in all college level coursework
- Completion of ENGL 1101, MATH 1108, and ECON 2101 or ECON 2102 with grades of “C” or higher

Declaration into the Bachelor of Science in Business Administration requires admission to the School of Business and a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS TO SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

- Admission to SIUE.
- Completion of pre-requisite courses: ENGL 1101, ENGL 1102, COMM 1101, CSCI 1102, ECON 2101, ECON 2102, ACCT 1101, MATH 1108, and MATH 2115 with grades of “C” or higher (Students may substitute MATH 1121 for both MATH 1108 and MATH 2115).

SCHOOL OF BUSINESS RETENTION AND GRADUATION POLICY

- Students must maintain a 2.25 cumulative GPA
- Students who do not meet this requirement for two consecutive semesters will be removed from the program

SIUE Business Administration students choose from among the following specializations: Computer Information Systems, Cybersecurity, Data Analytics, Economics, Entrepreneurship, Finance, Human Resource Management, International Business, Management, Marketing, and Supply Chain Management.
