**Brief description of the nature of the research/creative activity?**

During previous academic years, URCA student assistants, under guidance from the program director, pursued a project of mapping international studies resources, a follow-up content analysis of websites of International Studies academic programs, as well as interviews with International Studies faculty in national settings, in order to identify key trends in regards to education and professional opportunities in this interdisciplinary area. In fall 2025, URCA students are sought for a project building on the previous research to identify how social and environmental justice aspects are present and articulated in International Studies programs and coursework in the United States.

**Brief description of student responsibilities?**

Student responsibilities include:

- contributing to the selection and summarizing of materials
- analysis of the data collected
- writing up of the research results
- work towards presentations and publication

**URCA Assistant positions are designed to provide students with *research or creative activities* experience. As such, there should be measurable, appropriate outcome goals. What exactly should your student(s) have learned by the end of this experience?**

The research experience outcomes will include:

- acquiring expertise in data collection and analysis resulting in a portfolio of resources related to social and environmental justice in International Studies and a literature review
- building capability for analyzing research results
- building capability for writing a research report
- increasing presentation skills
